Water treatment plant restored to full capacity

Residents, businesses may use water as normal

Summary

As of 5:00 p.m. on December 22, 2018, the water treatment plant has returned at full capacity. Staff pinpointed the issue to a control device within the plant which malfunctioned during the power outage. The device has been replaced and the plant is now running normally.

Residents and businesses may go back to using water as normal and City pools will reopen on Saturday at 5 p.m. The City thanks the community for coming together over the past two days to conserve water and help maintain supply.

A special thanks to Nanaimo Forest Products and Associated Engineering for providing support to water treatment staff.

Quick Facts

- BC Hydro has reported Thursday's storm was the most devastating windstorm in 20 years.
- Staff believe the issue occurred when the generator failed or restarted and sent a bump of 'bad power' through the plant's control system. This caused a control device to fail. Operators diagnosed the problem with the assistance of Nanaimo Forest Products and Associated Engineering staff, and were able to swap a spare device in its place.
- At 4:00 a.m. on December 21, 2018, generators in the City of Nanaimo's water treatment plant suffered a breakdown. Plant operators were able to restore generator power however, a number of critical faults within the plant have been interrupting production.
